Join TCI at Midreshet Ein Hanatziv - A Beit Midrash for women where serious Torah studies meet an open-minded and innovative environment.

At the Midrasha, you will enjoy living and learning with Israeli peers along with special programming for overseas students! All this while living on a religious Kibbutz located in the lush Valley of Springs in northern Israel.

The Midrasha offers a study-centered program filled with social activities, self-management, and lots of fun!

Gemara focused curriculum including a variety of shiurim in Tanach, Chasidut, and contemporary Jewish issues.

Joint Study Sessions and Activities for Students from Midreshet Ein HaNatziv and Yeshivat Ma'aleh Gilboa:

In addition to classes at the Midrasha we have joint Shabatonim, study days and tiyulim, for TCI participants and the members of the overseas program at Yeshivat Ma'aleh Gilboa, our "twin brother" nearby. These study days will be led by senior teachers from the Yeshiva and the Midrasha: Rav David Bigman, Rabbanit Dr. Esther Fisher, Rabbanit Rachel Keren, and Rav Dr. Yosef Slotnik.

IDF accompaniment:

Upon completing their studies, many of our Israeli students serve in the IDF. We offer a complete accompaniment program that will allow students to make an educated decision about joining the IDF through "Machal." Students will spend time preparing mentally and physically with the guidance of our experienced staff, who will keep in contact with the students throughout their service.

Torah:

In our unique program each student can learn Torah her own way: choosing from a variety of subjects: Tanach, Gemara, Jewish Philosophy, Chasidut and more as part of a personal journey of study and experience of life on a Kibbutz.

Community:

The Midrasha is part of the Community of Kibbutz Ein Hanatziv. Each student has an English-speaking host family on Kibbutz, a "home away from home". Students take part in a variety of optional chessed activities supporting needy people in the region.

Israel:

During the year we will have on-site experiences, Tiyulim and meetings with various people and populations. All this in order to get better understanding of Israel, its landscapes, culture and society, focusing on contemporary social and cultural issues.

offers a Beit Midrash style of learning for Talmud and Halacha classes, specifically suited to the background and level of each student. We have several Gemara classes, which vary from beginner to advanced and include lectures, chavruta study, and personal mentors.

Additional curricular studies include: Tanakh and the history of Jewish Law, Jewish Philosophy, Chassidut, Torah commentaries, modern philosophers (Rav Kook, Rav Soloveichik, Heschel and more), Judaism and gender, topics in Jewish thought, “Bekiut” proficiency classes and more. Each student can choose which of the topics she wants to dive deep into and in which classes she will participate.

TCI is an opportunity to learn Torah while living amidst a vibrant, compelling Torah and Avoda community, to get acquainted firsthand with the uniqueness and challenges of the Northern Region of Israel. The Midrasha is part of the community of the Religious Kibbutz Ein Hanatziv. Each student has an English-speaking host family. The Kibbutz holds a variety of activities including cultural events – lectures, performances and more. The Midrasha students are integrated into these activities and participate together with the kibbutz members. In addition, as part of the program our students volunteer in supporting families and individuals in the Beit Shean Valley region.

We invite outstanding young women to experience a year of study, exploration, spiritual and social growth in an integrated Israeli program emphasizing the complex questions and challenges faced by the Jewish people and Israeli society today.

The yearlong curriculum will include dedicated study and on-site experiences (Tiyulim) to better understand Israeli culture and society and will focus on contemporary social and cultural issues such as minorities in Israel, challenges between center and periphery, social and inter-religious changes, Israel and world Jewry, the philosophy of Zionism past and present, the Religious Kibbutz Movement with its ethical and social values, and the State of Israel as a modern Jewish-Democracy.

General Information

The Midrasha is located on Kibbutz Ein Hanatziv which is known for its pastoral surroundings and unique, quiet atmosphere. There is a direct bus to Jerusalem which runs frequently throughout the day in addition to trains available from Tel Aviv area.

What we provide:

- 3 full meals a day
- Laundry services
- Medical insurance
- Internet access
- The students are housed in a fully accessorized, air-conditioned dormitory complex. Each room includes a full bathroom and a kitchenette, and houses up to 3 girls per room.
- Access to the Kibbutz sports facilities, including Swimming Pool, Basketball, Soccer, Tennis, and more.
- The Midrasha benefits from the Kibbutz's security system.

Acceptance Criteria:

- High motivation for Torah studies, volunteer work and social involvement
- A level of Hebrew sufficient to understand lectures and ability to read commentaries and rabbinical texts. Classes are held in Hebrew. (An intense Ulpan course is offered if needed to the overseas students during the first month of classes.)
