Our Shiurim

The shiurim that we offer at Eretz HaTzvi cover a wide range of topics and interests.

Every morning begins with an hour of halakha and contemporary topics. We then move to the Bet Midrash where we have guided Gemara learning with a havruta, and finish the morning off with Gemara shiur. Our goal is to teach you to how to learn Gemara, how to learn Rishonim and how to learn in depth.

Shiurim in the afternoon allow you to pursue a wide range of interests. In addition to our

curriculum of philosophical topics, you can choose from options within Tanakh, Halakha and Jewish Thought. This year, shiurim have included Sefer Bereishit, in-depth Parashat Hashavua, Sefer Daniel, in-depth Hilkhot Shabbat, Medical Ethics, Sefer Kuzari, and the Thought of Rav Soloveitchik.

In the evening, you are encouraged to pursue individual studies, including Rambam, additional Gemara and Halakha, with our Night Seder staff.



Our Faculty and Mentorship

We proudly boast an all-star faculty: learned in Torah, and also in possession of impressive academic credentials and worldly experience.

These are seasoned, accomplished Rabbanim who know how to handle sophisticated questions and have wisdom to share from their own journeys.

Many of our staff are published authors, writing detailed exegeses on various books of Tanakh, editing new editions of English translations of Tanakh, and writing about the intersection of halakha and the State of Israel. In short, you'll be in expert hands no matter what you are studying!

In addition, you'll be allocated a faculty member as a mentor for your time in yeshiva. Mentorship allows us to capitalize and maximize your one-on-one learning sessions, to make sure that a substantial list of topics is covered, and to have a member of the faculty oversee your development.
