The foundation on which the Yeshiva stands is serious and in-depth Torah study. For many years, Kerem B'Yavneh has emphasized study of Gemara b'iyun, and it is indeed known as one of the premier Yeshivot in the Torah world.

Emphasis is also placed on bekiut study. Every zman, the students aim to complete the masechta being studied, and many students choose to take optional exams to help them master the material.



Building the Torah Personality

Building the personality of a complete Torah scholar entails in-depth and serious knowledge of all of the realms of Torah.

In the Yeshiva, regular shiurim are given on a wide range of topics that expand the knowledge of the students.

These include Halacha, Machshava, Tanach and more.



Warm Home Atmosphere

Each student who enters the Yeshiva is given personal attention and assistance in acclimating to Yeshiva life. In addition to the Ramim, who personally supervise the talmidim, English-speaking avreichim invite the students to their homes, and madrichim are always available on campus to provide any assistance necessary.
