

Where is the Midrasha located? Where do the students live?

MTC is located on the Bet Elazraki campus in the beautiful city of Netanya. Our Bet Midrash and classrooms provide the perfect setting for our students to spend their mornings and evenings immersed in their Torah learning. The learning and environment of the Midrasha has a profound impact on the Home.

Our students live in three gorgeous villas within a few minutes walk of the main Bet Elazraki campus. The large villas allow our students to make themselves at home and enable them to form close bonds with each other. At MTC, we pride ourselves on our unique family atmosphere.

What kind of city is Netanya? Is there anything interesting to do there?

Netanya is a vibrant and picturesque coastal city with all the amenities of a large city, but the peace and quiet of a suburb. MTC is located within a 10 minute walk of the beautiful boardwalk and separate beach. There are malls, restaurants, supermarkets, stores and pharmacies all within walking distance as well – not to mention the 'kikar' – the central Netanya square! There is a bus stop at the end of our street with municipal buses as well as buses to lerusalem and other cities.

How close is MTC to Jerusalem?

Netanya is around an hour and fifteen minutes by car from Jerusalem. The bus takes around an hour and a half to travel between the two cities. We provide transportation to Jerusalem for "out Shabbatot" as well as Monday evenings, so our students can easily see their friends and family.

What is the food and laundry setup?

Three meals a day are provided for our students. In addition, the villas are equipped with basic kitchen appliances for the students who would prefer to make their own food.

There is a washer and dryer in each villa for the students to do laundry at their leisure.

What is the schedule for Shabbatot?

One Shabbat a month, we will have an "in-Shabbat" together with the children of Bet Elazraki – a unique and powerful experience. An additional Shabbat each month is spent together as a midrasha – either on campus together or at various communities across the country. The other two Shabbatot a month are "out Shabbatot" when our students are able to visit family and friends. MTC is your home for the year and so our campus is always open for students who want to stay in the dorms on "out Shabbatot".

What is a typical day like in MTC?

At MTC each day brings inspiring and stimulating classes alongside magical moments with the children of Bet Elazraki.

The mornings and evenings are spent learning from our talented teaching staff. From Jewish Philosophy to Halacha, and from Tanach to character development - our students build their schedules from a variety of topics and teaching styles.

The afternoons are dedicated to the children of Bet Elazraki where our students have the privilege of supporting and loving children who are not as fortunate as others. Our students have the opportunity to form deep relationships and impact them throughout the year. Get ready for your hearts to grow!

Do I have to know Hebrew to come? How will I communicate with the children?

Knowledge of Hebrew is not required. Although most children in Bet Elazraki speak only Hebrew, we have found that there is a language that overcomes the spoken one – the 'language of love'. The children see how much the MTC students care for them and invest in their lives and this 'language of love' overcomes any formal language barrier. The combination of our formal ulpan classes and the informal daily interaction with the children means that our students' Hebrew skills improve over the year.

Are there any tiyulim? Will we get to connect to Israel over the year?

We believe that an essential part of being in Israel for the year is to experience the land. We go on numerous day tiyulim as well as overnight tiyulim to make sure our students see the beauty of the land of Israel. Get ready for some fun!

In addition to seeing Israel, their days volunteering with Israeli children and working alongside Israeli girls their age spending their year in national service. These daily encounters will provide a unique insight into Israeli culture and society and allow for beautiful friendships.

What is the typical "Midreshet Torat Chessed" student?

At MTC, we are looking for a student who appreciates both aspects of our program, and will take both parts seriously – a young woman who recognizes the importance of both learning Torah and performing acts of chessed, and the ability of each aspect to enhance the other. A student who devotes herself to our challenging, yet rewarding, program will thrive during her year.

Our goal is for each student to grow at her own pace in a most real and profound way. Over the course of the year, we hope to arm our students with a newfound appreciation and commitment to their Judaism, as well as a keen understanding of the power of giving, and the impact it can have on their own lives.
