Daily Schedule Highlights



Iyun Seder

Understanding the methodology of the Gemara and sharpening analytical skills to assist talmidim in mastering independent indepth learning.



Bekiut Seder

Will focus on the improving of textual skills and expansion of the talmid's overall knowledge base. This will be facilitated by the availability and close supervision of our dedicated bekiut rabbeim.



Halacha Seder

Talmidim in shana aleph will cover chelek aleph of Mishnah Berurah with guidance of dedicated halacha rabbiem and worksheets. Weekly halacha shiurim will be given by Dayan Yehoshua Pfeffer.



Chumash B'Iyun

Talmidim will acquire knowledge and skills in learning Chumash through the eyes of chazal, two tracks will be offered:

- 1. Covering Sefer berisheit b'iyun with multiple peirushim.
- Exploring difficult sugyot throughout the Torah with specific meforshim in order to best understand the Torah's objective. An understanding of the methodology of each particular peirush will be highlighted.



Chazara Seder

A systematic chazara seder will be implemented throughout the day for both iyun and bekiut. Our chazara system ensures talmidim understand, retain, and master the material in addition to sharpening the skills required to learn for a lifetime.



Dynamic Chaburot

Post afternoon seder has a daily chaburah slot with unique learning opportunities. Next year opportunities include:

Our Staff



Rosh HaYeshiva Rabbi Dr. Chanan Apfel

Rabbi Dr. Apfel grew up in Brooklyn, New York, and attended Yeshiva of Flatbush High School and Yeshivat Sha'alvim in Israel. He completed his undergraduate studies at Columbia University, graduating in 1985 with a BA degree in Comparative Religion. While at Columbia, he learned for four years under Rabbi Yonason Sacks shlita as part of a campus Bais Medrash program. He received his MD degree from SUNY Downstate Medical School and subsequently completed a pediatric residency at Schneider Children's Hospital, followed by a fellowship in pediatric cardiology at Columbia University Medical Center. While pursuing his medical career, Rabbi Apfel continued learning with Rabbi Sacks at Yeshiva University, and received semicha from RIETS in 2003. He then served as a maggid shiur in the 12th grade Bais Medrash Katan program and as the 10th grade masmidim shiur rebbe at Yeshiva University High School for Boys (MTA). After making aliyah from Teaneck, New Jersey in 2010, Rabbi Apfel served as a Shana Bet RA"M in Yeshivat Torat Shraga and Yeshivat HaKotel, as well as a maggid shiur at Yeshivat Shaalvim.

Over the years, Rabbi Dr. Apfel has given courses in Medical Halacha and Bio-ethics at many institutions, including Yeshiva University, Lander College for Men, Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Gruss Kollel in Jerusalem, and at Sackler Medical School in Tel Aviv.

Rabbi Apfel currently gives an advanced gemara be'iyun shiur to yeshiva alumni attending the University of Pennsylvania, and also teaches a class in machshava at Michlala College for Women in Jerusalem. He is a sought-after lecturer and has published extensively on contemporary halachik and hashkafik issues. He is also the chief medical advisor for MILI, a non-profit organization in Israel that provides cardiac evaluation, recommendations and support for children with heart disease.



Menahel Rabbi Dani Abell

Rabbi Abell was born and raised in Chicago. After graduating from Fasman Yeshiva High School, he continued his growth at Yeshivat Shaalvim for three years. He went on to receive a bachelor's degree from Hebrew Theological College, in Skokie IL, followed by a master's in Jewish Education and Administration from Yeshiva University's, Azrieli Graduate School. In addition to receiving Semicha from HaRabbi Zalman Nehemiah Goldberg, he also completed the Mechanchim Counseling course at the Family Institute.

Rav Dani returned to Shaalvim with his wife Lea and spent six years learning at the Shaalvim Kollel and joined the staff as the Mashpia of the overseas program. It was during these years that he gained a strong connection with the Rosh Hayeshiva, Rabbi Michael Yammer, as well as the entire staff. Through their hadracha he was able to take on a central role with the talmidim, gaining a reputation for his warmth, excitement, and relatability.

After nearly a decade of learning and teaching at Yeshivat Shaalvim, Rav Dani began teaching at various seminaries, ultimately becoming a Rebbi and Administrator at MMY for the past 5 years. Rav Dani gave shiurim daily in both halacha and machshava, known for their depth, clarity, and practicality. He currently lives in Ramot with his wife and four children.



Rabbi Robbie Schrier

Rabbi Robbie Schrier was born and raised in Woodmere, New York. He attended HALB and DRS before leaving to study in Yeshivat Har Etzion in Alon Shevut, Israel. While attending Yeshiva University as an undergraduate and semicha student, Rabbi Schrier learned for many years under his principal rebbe, Rabbi Michael Rosensweig. Rabbi Schrier studied psychology and Jewish studies as an undergraduate student at YU.

Over the summers, he was a madrich on NCSY Kollel and became an advisor for Midwest NCSY during the year. After completing semicha, he became a member of the Wexner Kollel Elyon. For the past five years, he has served as a Night Seder Rebbe in Yeshiva University's growing night seder program where he aids talmidim in their study of gemara.

Additionally, he delivers mussar vaadim to the talmidim, drawing from classical works of mussar, chassidut, and machshava to craft messages that are pertinent to issues the talmidim face in their daily lives. He also has been a Rosh Chaburah for an early morning Kinyan HaMasechta chabura where he learns Gemara together with young professionals and working alumni of Yeshiva University. He has also served as a Resident Scholar in Congregation Darchei Noam (Fairlawn, NJ) for the past three years.

Rabbi (Dayan) Yehoshua Pfeffer

Rabbi (Dayan) Pfeffer grew up in London, England, and came at the age of 17 to study in Yeshiva in Israel - first at Beit Yisrael and later at Mir Yeshiva, where he studied for five years under the tutelage of Rabbi Asher Arieli. After marriage he learned for over a decade under Rabbi Asher Weiss, also earning semicha and Dayanut, and serving for some time as a Dayan on Rabbi Weiss's Beis Din. He also studied under Rabbi Moshe Shapiro zt"l for close to twenty years, participating in a variety of shiurim. Rabbi Pfeffer has a bachelor's and master's degree in law from Hebrew University and is a qualified attorney, having interned at Israel's Supreme Court (justice Neil Hendel). He has taught at several Yeshivot (most recently at Yeshivat Chedvat Ha-Torah in Jerusalem, which he partnered in founding) and academic institutions (currently at the law faculty of Hebrew University), has held several halacha-related posts (including halachic advisor to Israel's Chief Rabbi and moderating the dinonline.org website for over a decade), and currently heads the Haredi division of Israel's Tikvah Fund, where he established the Tzarich Iyun journal. Rabbi Pfeffer lives in Ramot, Jerusalem, with his wife (daughter of Rabbi Reuven Leuchter,) and eight children. He is the Rabbi of Kehillat Ohr Chadash, a flourishing and diverse Anglo community in Ramot Bet.



Rabbi Chaim Eisenstein

Rabbi Eisenstein is a sought after Rabbi known for his knowledge in Gemarah, Halacha, Chassidut, Shalom Bayit, Chinuch ha-Banim, and Avodat Hashem. He was educated at Yeshivat Torah Temima, Yeshivat Torah Vodaath, Yeshiva University and Teachers college at Columbia University, and received Semicha from RIETS in 2000 as a member of the Kollel Elyon.

After making Aliyah in 2004, Rabbi Eisenstein taught in Yeshivat Netiv Aryeh, and in 2008, joined the Gruss Kollel. Rabbi Eisenstein authored Netios Chain, which was published by RIETS in 2014, and his lectures reach worldwide audiences via YUTorah.org and TorahAnytime.com



Rabbi Daniel Apfel

Rabbi Daniel, a Teaneck, NJ native, attended MTA high school and subsequently studied for two years in Yeshivat Kerem B'Yavneh. Rabbi Apfel continued his Torah studies at Mir Yeshiva in Yerushalayim where he was taught by renowned talmidei chachamim Rabbi Eitan Yoffen and Rabbi Asher Arieli. He concurrently completed a BSc in computer science at The Open University of Israel.

Since then Rabbi Apfel has been teaching as the night seder sho'el u'meishiv for the overseas program at KBY where he engages the talmidim in their talmud torah and personal growth as well as delivering in depth gemarah shiurim. Having made aliyah, he currently resides in Ramat Beit Shemesh gimmel with his family.



Rabbi Yisrael Feld

Rabbi Feld grew up in Teaneck NJ and currently lives in Ramot with his wife and three children. He attended MTA for high school and went on to learn at Netiv Aryeh for two years. When returning back to America, Rabbi Feld balanced full days at Yeshiva University where he concentrated on Talmud Torah, studied psychology, and played on the YU basketball team.

After college, Rabbi Feld made Aliyah and studied in the Gruss Kollel where he received his YU Smicha. He is now a senior R'am at Yeshivat Torat Shraga and is a sought after speaker in many Yeshivot and seminaries. Rabbi Feld is also the director of Sulam summer programs and is known to inspire teenagers across the country. He has become well known for his ability to relate to and motivate his students, as well as maintain long lasting relationships.



Rabbi David Avichail

Rabbi Avichail is founder and Rosh Yeshiva of Yeshivat Ramot. He is an alumni of Yeshivat Mercaz Harav and served as an officer in the IDF. He went on to establish the Yeshiva High school in Mitzpe Rimon and served as the Rosh Yeshiva for 17 years. 
